# **Bachelor of Business Administration in Finance**

## **About This Program**

The Bachelor of Business Administration in Finance provides in-depth study on the management of money and draws upon concepts from economics, statistics, and mathematics to help investors and mangers make sound financial decisions. Finance is generally classified into three areas: corporate finance, investments and securities, and financial institutions.

# Competencies

- 1. Discipline-Specific Knowledge: Upon completion, undergraduate finance majors will understand theory and application in finance, investments, and financial institutions. This also encompasses basic finance principles such as the time value of money, risk and return, asset valuation, capital structure, and the functioning of financial institutions and markets.
- Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving Skills: Upon completion, undergraduate finance majors will be able to think logically about financial
  management problems. They should be able to choose and implement appropriate models and interpret outcomes so as to generate creative
  solutions to these problems.
- 3. Communication Skills: Upon completion, undergraduate finance majors will be able to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing. They should understand basic concepts of effective writing and public speaking.
- 4. Information Technology: Upon completion, undergraduate finance majors will be able to apply information technologies effectively.
