## **About This Program**

The Minor in Spanish Linguistics includes foundational courses that provide students with a solid background in the core areas of Spanish linguistics, as well as elective options that allow students to tailor their program of study to meet their interests and academic and professional goals. Students will learn about modern linguistic theory and the application of those theories to teaching, research, translation and interpreting, as well as other professions in the healthcare, business, and government sectors.

## Competencies

- 1. Upon completion, students will demonstrate proficiency in listening, reading, speaking, and writing Spanish (communication skills, critical thinking skills).
- Upon completion, students will demonstrate intercultural knowledge and competence in Hispanic cultures (social responsibility, global competence, critical thinking skills).
- 3. Upon completion, students will demonstrate an understanding of course content knowledge as it pertains to Spanish linguistics (e.g., phonology, morphology, syntax, dialectology, language acquisition, and/or history of the Spanish language) (disciplinary knowledge, critical thinking skills).
