The Post-Master's Nursing Administration Certificate enables individuals with a master's degree in nursing to advance in professional roles of nursing administration as well as provide a pathway toward doctoral programs in nursing practice.

The MSN Administration core courses may be taken in the Accelerated Online format only, or an equivalency course with credit hours transferred to UTA. Required courses will be determined by a gap analysis completed by the program director.
