

# Minor in Diversity Studies

## About This Program

The Diversity Studies Minor is designed to strengthen students' understanding of the interactions of race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, social and economic inequality, disability, aging and religion in defining identity and social relationships. This interdisciplinary program of study focuses on key concepts related to power, identity, difference, and the historical and structural forces that shape power and difference in social relationships. The goal of the minor is to arm students with knowledge, skills, and perspectives essential to civic participation, career development and promoting a just society. The Diversity Studies minor is relevant to careers involving diverse populations such as business, industry, education, social welfare, mental health, and physical health.

## Competencies

2. Upon completion, students will be able to engage Anti-Racism, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (ADEI) in practice.
